Tuition—Students are required to send a deposit of \$100 with their application. The deposit is credited toward the tuition, and is non-refundable. If a student is not accepted, the deposit will be refunded. The tuition is \$820, due in full on the first day of class. Dependent children under 12 years of age receive a 50% discount. If a student withdraws from the program within the first week, 50% of the tuition is refunded. After 7 days there is no refund.

Room & Board—All students are provided housing on the Health Retreat campus. Each student should expect to have a roommate. We serve an excellent vegetarian diet (no animal or dairy products). Two meals plus a light supper are provided each day. We ask our students to maintain this diet while a resident on our campus. Students are required to assist in the preparation of meals and kitchen clean-up. This helps to keep our costs at a minimum, and provides a practical education in food preparation.

Textbooks—The class materials fee is \$25, and is in addition to the tuition fee of \$820.

Computers—Wireless internet access is available for students with personal laptops; access is limited to designated time periods.

Dress—We ask for your cooperation in helping us to maintain a modest, professional environment both in and outside of the classroom. Women are expected to wear dresses or skirts at all times. Culottes, if they are feminine in appearance and loose fitting, are permitted. Men may wear shorts if they are loose fitting and fall below the knee. We have found that these dress guidelines help us to maintain a “minimum distraction” environment as we study principles of Christian living.

Laundry—Laundry facilities are available. Students should bring their own laundry soap (as well as other personal hygiene items, including toothpaste, soap, etc.). The laundry in the Health Center is reserved for our lifestyle guests.

Interaction With Guests—We anticipate that our students will have a positive influence on our lifestyle guests. However, we encourage our students not to enter into theological discussions with our guests. “The sanitarium parlor, where are gathered a promiscuous crowd of patients, is not the place to talk upon doctrinal subjects. Let our consistent lives win confidence and awaken a desire to know why we believe as we do. Then invite those who inquire to attend the Sabbath meetings.”—Ev. P. 539.

Parlor—The parlor in the Health Center belongs to the lifestyle guests. Permission must be obtained from the Director if students desire to use the parlor.
